

✓ Poll Tax

An Ordinance providing for the
Collection of Poll Tax
Be it ordained by the Board of
Trustees of Grand Junction—

Sec 1 That every male resident of this town
over the age of twenty-one years
and under the age of fifty years,
shall annually pay to the Street
Commissioners of this town, a
Poll Tax of Two dollars—but
any person in lieu thereof may
labor each year one day upon
the public streets of said town
under the supervision of the Street
Commissioners—

Sec 2 The Street Commissioners shall
between the first day of April
and the first day of November,
in each year notify all persons
in this town, subject to said
tax, to appear at such time—
and place and with such tools
as he may designate, to per-
form the amount of work
required in lieu of said
tax, provided that nothing
in this section shall prevent
the Street Commissioners from
calling out any of such per-
sons, to perform such work
at any time, when he shall
consider such work needed

✓ Poll Tax

Sec 3 Any person failing to present himself for labor, or failing to pay the amount which is taken in lieu of such labor within ten days after it is demanded by the Street Commissioner, shall be sued for the amount in an action for debt, and no set off shall be allowed thereto.

Sec 4 The Street Commissioner shall report to the Board of Trustees when required so to do, a list of all persons in this town subject to poll tax - the names of all persons who have performed the labor instead thereof - the amount of money collected, and paid out by him - from whom received - to whom and for what paid - the number of days - he himself has been in actual service - and a list of the delinquents -

Sec 5 An ordinance entitled "an act entitled an Ordinance providing for the collection of Poll Tax" - Approved Sept: 27 1882 is hereby reheard -
