

## Salary of Mayor

Noted down.

An ordinance providing for the submission to the vote of the qualified electors of Grand Junction a proposition to pay the Mayor of said Town a salary of (\$600) Six hundred dollars per annum.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Grand Junction,

Sec 1 That there shall be submitted to the vote of the qualified electors of the Town of Grand Junction, on the (26th day of March 1884) for their ratification or rejection, the proposition to pay the Mayor of Grand Junction a salary of Six hundred dollars (\$600) per annum out of the treasury of said Town.

Sec 2 All persons voting on the question shall vote by separate ballot - which shall be deposited in a box to be used for that purpose only - and on which ballot shall be printed the words "For paying the Mayor of Grand Junction a salary of (\$600) Six hundred <sup>dollars</sup> per annum" or "Against paying the Mayor of Grand Junction a salary of (\$600) Six hundred dollars per annum".

The votes so cast shall be counted, and the result determined in the same manner as provided by law for the canvass and return of votes for the election of Town Officers.

Sec 3 The place of casting said vote shall be the office of the Board of Trustees of said Town in Carpenters Block on 5th St between Main St. and Colorado Avenue in said Town.
