

**An Ordinance Concerning
Gambling.**

*Be it Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town
of Grand Junction.*

SECTION 1. If any person or persons shall set up, have or keep any kind of keno table, poker table, faro-bank, or other gaming table or other instrument, device or apparatus, whereon or with which any money or other property shall in any manner be played for, every such person shall on conviction be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense.

SEC. 2. If any person or persons shall play for money or any valuable thing at any game of cards or dice or with any article, device or apparatus whatever which may be used for the purpose of playing or betting upon or winning or losing money or other property, or shall bet on any game others may be playing, every such person shall on conviction be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 3. If any person or persons shall permit or suffer any faro-bank, keno table, poker table, or other instrument, device or apparatus whatever, used for the purpose of playing games of chance, to be set up, used or kept for such purpose, in any building or tenement in his or their possession or under his or their control, every such person or persons shall on conviction be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 4. If the owner or keeper of any gambling house or room, or any person or persons within the same, shall refuse to permit any member of the Board of Trustees, the Town Marshal, or any other police officer, to enter the same, it shall be lawful for any such officer to enter the same or cause the same to be entered by force, by breaking the doors or otherwise, and arrest, with or without warrant, all suspicious persons found therein. Any person who shall obstruct or resist the Town Marshal or other police officer in the performance of any act authorized by this Section, shall on conviction be fined not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.
