

An Ordinance.

Be it Ordained By the Board of Trustee of the town of Grand Junction, Colorado:

SECTION 1. Whoever shall have the water license and shall use, or shall wrongfully permit to be used, the water from the hydrants or pipes designated in his license for any other purpose than that specified therein, or shall wrongfully permit or suffer any person not having a license to use water from such hydrants or pipes, and shall wrongfully neglect to inform the Superintendent or other authorized agent of the company of such use, or shall permit any unnecessary waste therefrom, or shall cause or negligently suffer or permit the water to run from such hydrant or pipes except for such use, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 2. Whoever shall, by himself or any of his family or any of his agents, servants or employes, use the water from any part of the waterworks without a license, or shall, without lawful authority, open any fire-plug, stop-cock or valve, or any other fixture appertaining to said waterworks, or shall let on or shut off water into or from any pipe, without lawful authority, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 3. Whoever shall throw or cast any substance into any reservoir, stream, trench, pipe, drain, valve, box or stop box used in and necessary for the construction, maintenance and operation of such waterworks and which substance shall tend to fill up such reservoir or to fill up or obstruct any such stream, trench, pipe, drain or boxes, or shall throw or cast into any such place any such filthy, or other substance, that shall tend to pollute the water therein shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 4. Any person who shall throw or cast into the stream or source from which such water is taken, for five (5) miles above the point from which it is taken, any filthy or other substance that shall tend to pollute the water therein shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 5. Whoever shall injure or deface or impair any point or appertences of such waterworks shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. Any person upon conviction of any misdemeanor specified in this ordinance or upon conviction of the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in sum not less than five (\$5) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and shall pay all damages arising from any violation thereof.
