

An Ordinance

Concerning slaughter houses and other unwholesome and offensive business.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Grand Junction.

Section 1. If any person shall slaughter, kill or dress any cattle, calves, sheep or swine, or steam any lard or tallow, or store any green or dry hides within the limits of this town, or within one mile of the limits thereof, or occupy or use any building for the purposes or uses aforesaid, without a permit from the Board of Trustees of said Town, every such person shall, on conviction, be fined for each offense in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars. Any person desiring to obtain such permit shall make application thereof to the Board of Trustees, stating the nature of the permission requested and specifying the premises and location whereon the same is applied for. The board of Trustees may in their discretion, revoke such permit at any time.

Section 2. No person (who may obtain a permit for any business mentioned in the preceding section,) shall suffer to remain on his premises any blood, bones, filth, offal or other matter, so that the same shall become offensive or unwholesome or endanger the health of, or be an annoyance to the neighborhood. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall pay a fine of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.
