

## Ordinance No. 48.

An ordinance concerning children under eighteen years of age.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION:

SECTION 1.—That the loitering or playing about stores, offices, saloons, abandoned or vacant buildings, and the playing upon or loitering about the streets or alley or other public places in this city of a minor child under eighteen years of age, in the night time after nine o'clock p. m., without being in the company of, or having the written permission of the parent or other lawful guardian of such minor child, shall be and is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and any such person violating any of the provisions of this section, shall upon conviction, be fined in a sum not less than one dollar, nor more than fifty dollars for each offense.

SECTION 2.—It shall be the duty of the janitor of the city hall, each night at nine o'clock p. m., to cause the fire bell to be rung five times, or taps, and such ringing shall be conclusive of the time.
