

ORDINANCE No. 68.

An Ordinance Concerning Saloons.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction:

SEC. 1. That between the hours of twelve o'clock, midnight, and six o'clock in the morning of each day in the week, and between twelve o'clock Saturday night and six o'clock Monday morning of each week, it shall be unlawful for the owners, managers or proprietors of any saloon, tippling house, dram shop or other place licensed under the Ordinances of this city to retail liquor, to have in any such places any windows of stained or frosted glass; nor shall any window shades, screens or other obstructions be placed nor maintained thereon, or therein during the times aforesaid; nor shall any screens, shades, blinds, stained or frosted glass or other obstruction be so placed or maintained in any such room or place of business during the times aforesaid, as to obstruct in any manner, a clear view from the street of the interior of any such room or rooms where such liquors are or may at other times be sold, bartered, exchanged or given away in this city. The owners, managers and proprietors of any such places as aforesaid, and their agents and employes who shall maintain or keep any such obstruction or obstructions as in this ordinance prohibited, shall be subject to such fine and imprisonment as in this ordinance provided, and any person or persons convicted of a violation of this ordinance, to whom a retail liquor license has been granted, shall, upon order of the city council, forfeit all rights under such license, and the same shall be cancelled and revoked.

SEC. 2. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be fined in a sum not less than 20 dollars nor more than 100 dollars, or be imprisoned not exceeding sixty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
