

Introduction

The 1992 City of Grand Junction Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Master Plan identified the need for a regional park in the north-central area of the city, resulting in the acquisition of the 205 acre Matchett Park property in 1996 from Dr. and Mrs. Matchett. The park is located adjacent to Patterson and 28 1/4 Roads and has remained undeveloped. Today a majority of the park is operated under a farm lease, with many people using the farm roads for walking, running, biking and disc golf.

Since Matchett Park was acquired, two sizable parks have been developed in the Grand Valley - Canyon View Park in 1997 and Long Family Memorial Park in 2006. These two parks have been extremely beneficial to the entire valley; however, they are not sufficient to keep pace with the increasing demands from outdoor recreational user groups. For example, multipurpose field rentals have increased 130% and shelter rentals have increased 123% since 2006.

The dense neighborhoods surrounding Matchett Park only have 7.8 acres of park that is accessible without crossing Patterson or going much further east or west. In 2012, City Council directed staff to complete a master plan for the park based on these pressing needs. The City was successful in obtaining a Great Outdoors Colorado grant to fund 75% of the total master planning cost. Matchett Park will serve as a critical north-central location for regional activities. This master planning process helped prioritize the community's vision and goals for the future of the park.




Figure 1: Drive time distances within 5, 10, and 30 minutes of Matchett Park.




Figure 3: Existing Land Use Allocation. Matchett Park is located south of I-70 and the Highline Canal and north of Patterson Road, in the north-central area of Grand Junction.

Legacy Design

Overview:

Design Workshop's Legacy Design process emphasizes a deliberate comprehensive approach to sustainable design solutions that includes four Legacy categories: environment, community, art and economics. All aspects of the design process and foundational thinking for the Matchett Park project are captured in this document. Issues associated with the project and the City of Grand Junction Parks and Recreation Department's Critical Success Factors were defined at the outset. The design team and the City defined a project Vision, a problem statement called a Dilemma and a design solution called a Thesis. These steps are used to build a strong foundational story for the project that aligns the design team and client to the same Legacy Principles and Legacy Goals.

This document provides a visual and textual story of the design analysis, definitions and discoveries that led to planning solutions and conclusions. It is intended for use in presenting the Master Plan Vision for adoption; to educate the public on the decision-making process; and to serve as the foundation for the next phases of the design process in which the plan will evolve and be implemented.

Project Dilemma and Thesis

Dilemma:

How do you identify and meet the needs of a regional park within the neighborhood, local, and regional scales of the Grand Valley community while managing competing interests and stakeholders and being inclusive and transparent to the community at large?

Thesis:

Through a rigorous and transparent community engagement process that is inclusive of all future user groups, create a park master plan that identifies a clear set of values and programmatic uses, expresses the culture of the region and is authentic to place, responds to physical environmental constraints, and is able to be phased and evolve over time.

Project Goals

COMMUNITY

- Create year-round asset while being sensitive to adjacent uses
- Provide safe pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicular access/circulation
- Build social capital, educational & long term investment opportunities
- Increase opportunities for both people-to-people and people-to-nature experiences

ECONOMICS

- Maximize future investment through land use decisions
- Examine revenue generating opportunities
- Outline a phased approach that accounts for current practices
- Examine cost-reducing measures in the areas of operations, maintenance, etc.

ENVIRONMENT

- Ensure design protects natural features
- Leverage distinctive qualities of Indian Wash & site context
- Incorporate national best practices
- Strategically locate water intensive vs. non water intensive land uses

ART

- Protect and enhance physical and cultural resources
- Select material appropriate to the Grand Valley

Community Engagement Process:







Figure 5: The Programming Process Diagram conceptually depicts the Matchett Park programming public engagement process over the three month timeline from January to March, 2014.

Engaging the community was the foundation of the Matchett Park master planning process. As depicted in *Figure 5*, the team sought input at each of three critical project master planning stages. The first round of public engagement identified the initial goals and generated programming ideas. The second phase engaged the community in a dialogue about the character of the design and helped to illustrate size, location, and quantity of different programmatic elements on the site. The third project phase recapped the process and presented a preferred master plan.

The first two public workshops solicited real-time feedback through keypad polling sessions. Online surveys that corresponded with the meeting presentations were employed to gain an understanding of the larger community's needs and desires for Matchett Park. Additionally, City staff held small group meetings with community recreation and neighbors to ensure that all interests were being heard. Email, newspaper articles, television news, social media, and the City's website were all used to spread the word about Matchett Park throughout Grand Junction and the Grand Valley.

In total, 483 people attended the three community meetings held at Faith Heights Church. An additional 1,792 people participated in the corresponding online surveys.

WORKSHOP 1

The first public workshop was held on January 9, 2014, to gain an understanding of the community's ideas for programming at Matchett Park, including what uses are and aren't appropriate and to identify program opportunities that are missing from the overall Grand Junction Parks and Recreation system. Public input was gathered through instant feedback electronic polling, a prioritization exercise in which attendees were given dot stickers to place on boards listing all types of potential activities, and through comment cards. Following the public meeting, the electronic polling questions were posted to an online survey to capture the values and opinions of community members who were unable to attend in person. The key findings of the public workshops and the online surveys are included on the following pages, while the complete polling and survey responses are included in the appendix of this document.



KEY FINDINGS:

179 people attended the first public meeting, with an additional 1,199 participating via the online survey hosted through the City's website. Feedback from this round of engagement began to clarify the community's goals for Matchett Park and identified what people would like to see included when the park is complete.

It is important to note the demographic make-up of those present at the first open house in order to explain the great variation with the larger population polled online.

Workshop 1

- Approximately 179 individuals were polled
- 58% live directly adjacent or within walking distance of Matchett Park
- 62% were ages 51 or older

Online Poll

- The online survey collected responses from 1,199 people
- A smaller percentage of responses were from people living directly adjacent to the park. The majority of responses were from people who live within Grand Junction but do not live within walking distance of the park (42%). 17% of respondents live within walking distance of the park.
- A more diverse cross-section of age groups was represented with the majority from the 31-40 (28%) and 41-50 (24%) year old age groups.

Workshop 1 - Electronic Polling

The open house electronic polling revealed that the public is interested in a diversity of park recreational uses that are accessible to various user types, abilities and ages. There was strong support for maintaining the existing natural qualities and quiet character of the park and to include a diversity of trails. A community recreation center was also strongly supported, but this group did not show significant interest in designated athletic fields, and, as a whole, showed more opposition to them than support. Informal or flexible multipurpose fields, on the other hand, were supported. The respondents showed interest in fitness areas, picnic areas, playgrounds, and outdoor performance space, amongst other passive uses. There was a close split between those that wanted to see a dog park versus those who did not.


Given that this group is mostly from the adjacent neighborhood, there were also strong reactions to increased traffic and the routing of future roads, along with concerns regarding increased noise and vandalism. Overcrowding was also identified as an important issue.

Round 1 - Online Survey


The online survey results aligned with responses from the electronic polling, revealed support for a diversity of park recreational uses that are accessible to various user types, abilities and ages. The facilities respondents feel are missing from the larger Grand Junction Parks and Recreation system include a community recreation center as well as passive areas for people to enjoy being in the outdoors. Respondents showed strong support for more passive recreational opportunities at Matchett Park, in addition to amenities for families and children. In general, respondents were in favor of active recreation facilities for soccer, basketball and tennis, as well as spaces for more informal activities such as fitness areas and an outdoor aquatic park. For the most part, the electronic polling responses had only a small percentage of participants who were in opposition to organized league and informal active recreation facilities, with greater opposition to the dirt jump bike park and skateboard/in-line skate park. There was strong support across the board for all of the passive recreation uses at Matchett Park. Similar to the workshop polling responses, there was both support and opposition for a dog park, with 31% of survey respondents against and 54% in favor of this use.

Managing vandalism, traffic and overcrowding are the most important issues to manage with the development of Matchett Park. Parking is thought to be best accommodated in medium sized lots that are dispersed throughout the park and are proportionate to each adjacent use. In both the electronic and online surveys, the preference for the park's aesthetic character is to emphasize its natural context.




When you think about Grand Junction Parks and Recreation, what are amenities you think are missing or that the area could use more of? (Select all that apply)






**I would be in favor of the following active recreational uses (organized league) at this park:




Open House Meeting Dot Voting Exercise


Activities receiving the strongest support during the first Workshop include pickleball, skateboarding, swimming, disc golf, trails, a community recreation center, and basic park facilities (restrooms). The public was also asked to post additional comments and ideas in this exercise. Some of these ideas include an arboretum, art, open space, and more voicing of traffic concerns. The following charts provide a summary of the results of this exercise.






Active • Informal


Comment Cards/Email Comments

The comments received were primarily gathered at the first public open house, totaling 49 returned at the meeting and eight individuals emailing their thoughts, ideas and concerns. In assessing the comments, the following programmatic elements emerged as important from this group:

- trails (approx. 21)
- recreation/community center (approx. 11)
- skateboard park (approx. 10)
- keeping Matchett in its natural state (approx. 11)
- ample and convenient parking (approx. 6)

A number of concerns were also listed including light pollution, traffic, security, maintenance, noise, and activities in proximity to existing neighborhoods. Since this meeting was heavily attended by members of the neighborhood, there was also a good group of people that would like to see no changes or development occur here. Within a recreation center, people have ideas to see indoor/outdoor pools and water features, indoor/outdoor walking track, community meeting and gathering spaces, increased fitness programs, and even a small café.

The following two graphics illustrate some of the comments heard at the first meeting, and collectively with the online feedback.



I would like to see unique characteristics/amenities, not just a duplicate of other parks.

An area for outdoor music would be fun.

I would like to see a place with shade for parents to watch the children play!

Informal fields would be great with disc golf, horseshoes, splash pad.

This should not be another "sports" area for a limited number of users.

The park should be kept as natural as possible – a place where people can walk, picnic, relax in the outdoors.

Playgrounds that are inclusive for handicapped kids; pedestrian access so kids can walk/bike there.

Family fun and safe for pets and wildlife.

A recreation center would be my #1 priority.

Healthy activities for all ages in a safe environment.

Make a safer and larger skate park that everyone will enjoy.

My highest priority is to see Matchett stay as open space.

Restrooms, safe bridges over the wash, removal of Tamarisk, and a creek side trail

A beautiful park with space for numerous activities- festivals, sports, nature- playground equipment for children.

To have a brand new skate park for the community to learn and have fun at!

WORKSHOP 2

The second public workshop was held on February 13, 2014. Three conceptual diagrams were presented to gain an understanding of preferred circulation and connection scenarios; the locations of related and compatible uses; the interface with the adjacent neighbors; potential locations for a future elementary school, charter school, and community recreation center; and to study infrastructural needs and requirements including stormwater detention, irrigation ponds, and roadway types.

Each of the three concept diagrams have a common set of criteria based on previous planning efforts and design direction from Grand Junction City Staff. The plans respond to the demands of the 2035 Transportation Plan which requires the future connection of 28 1/4 Road to Cortland Avenue and Cortland Avenue east to 29 Road. 28 1/4 Road is the only access point out of the park that will permit a left turn onto Patterson Road at a signalized intersection. The three road alternatives illustrate these connection opportunities.

Other design criteria for the plan alternatives consisted of the inclusion of a 14 acre school district (10 acres for an elementary school and 4 acres for a future Independence Academy); the location of a potential community recreation center; and limited access in and out of the park at Patterson Road. In all scenarios, Indian Wash is envisioned to remain in its natural state, with low intensity uses such as trails, biking, and nature play. The three concepts were intended to demonstrate different approaches to various elements of the park design.



DESIGN ALTERNATIVES

Alternative A - Agricultural Grid

The “Agricultural Grid” concept is inspired by the traditional square mile grid network predominant in Grand Junction, as well as the agricultural heritage of the site. The existing irrigation canals remain in this design alternative. A pond creates a focal point in the central portion of the site with multipurpose fields creating a great lawn to the south. The schools and recreation center are sited in a traditional campus quad arrangement.

Circulation:

In this option, Cortland Avenue follows the canal along the north property line. 28 1/4 Road connects north to Cortland Avenue and provides a buffer between the existing neighborhood and the park. Both Ridge Drive and Hawthorne Avenue connect into 28 1/4 Road. Alternative A shows a secondary access point off of Patterson Road, in the center of the southern portion of the site, which leads into a “campus quad” loop road layout.

School Location:

Alternative A places the charter school and elementary school in a campus “quad” configuration, located across from one another.


Recreation Center Location:

A site for a potential recreation center is included in each of the options. Alternative A and B locate the facility in the southern portion of the site with high visibility and easy access from Patterson Road, where there can be a synergy with the future elementary schools.





Alternative A - The Agricultural Grid



Alternative B - The Great Panorama

The panoramic views to Mount Garfield and Grand Mesa inform the design layout of this alternative. A central lawn is oriented to maximize views. A pond is located to the south along Indian Wash to provide opportunities for fishing or wildlife viewing. Parking is spread throughout the site, while the school and recreation center sites are along Patterson Road.

Circulation:

In Alternative B, 28 1/4 Road is sited in the same location as Alternative A. However, only Ridge Drive connects through. Cortland Avenue follows along the west side of Indian Wash, crossing in the center to connect to 29 Road. Alternative B shows a secondary access point off of Patterson Road which is against the eastern edge of the property and cuts through the neighboring property to access 28 1/4 Road.

School Location:

Alternative B provides a buffer between the schools and Patterson Avenue, with the schools located to the north of the access road.

Recreation Center Location:

A site for a potential recreation center is included in each of the alternatives. Alternative A and B locate the facility in the southern portion of the site with high visibility and easy access from Patterson Road, where there can be a synergy with the future elementary schools.





Alternative B - The Great Panorama

Alternative C - Free Flowing

A free flowing, or organic, network of paths and roads create the framework for this alternative. Two ponds linked by a streambed frame a central lawn. The internal road circulation is pulled into the eastern portion of the site, allowing for more contiguous space within the core of the park. A shaded promenade provides formal pedestrian access through the park. The schools are sited along Patterson Road, while the Recreation Center is pulled to the northeast of the site.

Circulation:

In Alternative C, 28 1/4 Road cuts immediately east across the park. Cortland Avenue follows Indian Wash, where 28 1/4 joins into it. Hawthorne Avenue provides local neighborhood access to 28 1/4 Road. Alternative C is similar to Alternative A with the secondary access point centered along the southern edge of the site, but also has the 28 1/4 Road access through the neighboring parcel.


School Location:

Alternative C places the schools across from one another along the access road off of Patterson Avenue.


Recreation Center Location:

A site for a potential recreation center is included in each of the options. Alternative C places the recreation center in the north east corner of the site where the topography is accommodating. This option distributes some of the activity of the park to the north.





Alternative C - Free Flowing



KEY FINDINGS:

The second workshop attracted a similar number of people as the first workshop with 178 community members in attendance. An additional 593 online surveys were completed from February 13th through March 3rd, providing opinions from members of the community who were unable to attend the meetings in person. Feedback from this round of engagement confirmed the programming needs and desires identified in the first round of public engagement and garnered feedback on elements of the three initial design concepts.

Similar to the demographic breakdown of the first round of engagement, there continued to be differences in the demographic make-up of the open house attendees in comparison to the online survey respondents; however, results from both engagement strategies yielded similar results with a few exceptions noted in the discussion below.

Workshop 2

- 178 individuals were polled
- 64% live directly adjacent or within walking distance of Matchett Park
- 69% were ages 51 or older, with 18% between ages 31-50
- 11-18 year olds represented 5% of attendees (though a small percentage of total respondents, it is worthy of noting this traditionally underrepresented age group)

Online Poll

- 593 people responded
- A smaller number of the responses were from people living directly adjacent or within walking distance of the park (27%), the majority of responses were from people who live in Grand Junction but do not live within walking distance of the park (45%).
- There was a more even representation of 31-50 (49%) and 51-70+ (54%) year old age groups.

The first set of questions reaffirmed the programming needs and desires of community members from the first round of polling and survey questions for organized and informal active recreation, appropriate trail facilities and special events, and what dog facility types are suitable at Matchett Park. The complete polling and survey questions and responses are included in the Appendix.

- **Active / Organized Recreation** - Responses from both collection methods supported the inclusion of multipurpose athletic fields as the primary need for organized, active recreation. In both the polling and online survey results there remains some desire to maintain a more informal or passive park, with 28% of electronic polling respondents (primarily neighbors or nearby residents) and 11% of online survey respondents choosing the option to have no active/organized elements.
- **Active / Informal Recreation** - In both response groups there was little opposition to the options presented for active / informal recreation at Matchett Park, with the most support for fitness areas, an outdoor aquatic park and disc golf.
- **Trails** - Trails of various circuit lengths are a welcome improvement to Matchett Park (in both polling and online responses) with dual surface pathways, multi-use trails, soft surface paths, and fitness trails all receiving strong support.
- **Dog Facilities** - Just over 60% of both groups felt that on-leash trail use was appropriate and 44% favored locating an off-leash dog park at Matchett Park. There was some discrepancy between the polling results, which showed less support for an off-leash dog park and more support for no-dog facilities, however the responses from those who were not supportive of dog facilities represented a smaller percentage than those who felt dog facilities were appropriate.
- **Special Events** - Special events including outdoor concerts, organized run/walks, and movie nights were generally supported by those who responded to the polling and online survey.


The second set of questions sought feedback on different elements of the three design alternatives; A. The Agricultural Grid, B. The Great Panorama, and C. Free Flowing. These three options were depicted to show design solutions that could be broken down or extracted and combined in different ways to arrive at a preferred alternative for the Master Plan. Results from both the keypad polling and the online survey were generally in agreement with their preferred design solutions, supporting the following design elements from each alternative:

- Locating through streets at both Ridge Drive and Hawthorne Avenue (Alternative A)
- Southern access points configured in a quad formation, centered at the southern edge of the parcel (Alternative A)
- A circulation pattern in which Cortland Avenue comes south to meet up with the curvilinear alignment of 28 1/4 Road at a round-about to the west of Indian Wash (Alternative C)
- Locating the 14 acre school site at the southern end of the parcel (Alternative C)
- Locating a footprint for a possible future community recreation center along Indian Wash (Alternative C)
- Preferred concept idea as shown in Free Flowing (Alternative C)


Community feedback, along with staff discussions, yielded a preferred circulation pattern of Alternative C combined with the Great Panorama view concept of Alternative B. The final master plan seeks to respect the polling results, primarily representing the opinions of those living in close proximity to the park and the 51+ demographic, and balancing the needs for a more active park, as illustrated in the responses from larger cross section of the Grand Junction population.







WORKSHOP 3

The third and final public workshop was an open house to present the preferred alternative. City staff and team members were stationed at several locations to have one-on-one discussions with attendees. The preferred alternative combined the programming needs and desires identified in the first public workshop with the design considerations and site constraints identified in stakeholder and technical team discussions.

A total of 126 community members attended the final open house workshop. No formal electronic polling or survey results were collected; however, workshop attendees had the opportunity to comment on the master plan design and offer feedback for next steps.

Comments collected at this meeting were mostly positive and many voiced support for the park's design and development. Almost 60% (22) of the written comments received at the meeting addressed the skate park and the request for this program element to be designed professionally to accommodate all styles, ages, and abilities. There was emphasis on the need for a world class skate park facility and the contributions such a facility could have on the community and economy.

Additional comments included addressing strategies to mitigate the impact of noise from the park on neighboring properties, concerns about traffic speed and volumes, parking near Ridge Drive, and protecting views.



Master Plan

A preferred Master Plan evolved from feedback recorded during the second workshop and discussions held with the City staff steering committee. The master plan organizes the park around a grand lawn, directing views to the Bookcliffs, Mt. Garfield and the Grand Mesa. The plan also pulls 28 1/4 Road through the site to the western edge of Indian Wash, connecting with the Cortland Avenue Extension and, eventually, 29 Road.

Backbone Infrastructure

Roadways

The backbone infrastructural components of the master plan include utility alignments, stormwater management planning, pond and irrigation piping schemes, and roadway plans. Hawthorne Avenue is slated to connect to 28 1/4 Road, and follow along the South Pond to the western edge of Indian Wash. A round-about will signal the convergence of 28 1/4 Road with Cortland Avenue. Cortland Avenue will enter the northwestern portion of the site and continue to the roundabout, cross over Indian Wash with a new bridge and connect 29 Road to the east. The roadways will be sinuous parkways with dividing medians. The intent is to cue drivers to slow down as they traverse the park. A right-in/right-out connection of Patterson Road to 28 1/4 Road will also be added in the south-central portion of the site bordering Patterson Road. This will provide direct access to the proposed locations for a new elementary school, a new charter school, and a future community recreation center.

Parking

Parking areas with a total of 1,652 spaces are included throughout the master plan. Two main parking lots will accommodate events and activities on the Great Lawn. Together, those parking areas will hold 911 spaces with over 80 more spaces for direct overflow. Parking areas have also been considered with direct access to other park features, like the North Pond off of Cortland Avenue, The Recreation Center, and access from 29 Road directly to the amenities located within Indian Wash. Several small neighborhood lots may also be considered to provide park access to residents.

Infrastructure

The site, as it exists today, is relatively flat with the exception of the Indian Wash drainage area. Stormwater will move across the site collecting in ponds and detention and retention basins at the south eastern portion of the site. Existing irrigation ditches will be re-routed and piped. The ditches will feed the two new ponds, with water from these ponds being used for park irrigation.

Maintenance

A new park maintenance facility will be located at the north-west corner of the park with access from Cortland Avenue. The maintenance yard will service Matchett Park as well as other city parks in this region. The maintenance yard is projected to be approximately 3.3 acres.

The Center

The Great Lawn

The Central Phase, or core, of Matchett Park is organized around a Great Lawn and Community Pavilion. The Great Lawn is approximately 33 acres and can accommodate 11 standard multipurpose playing fields. It terminates on one edge with a community pavilion where events can be staged.

Pedestrian Promenade

A tree lined promenade provides a buffer between the main parking lots and the Great Lawn. It follows the line of the existing irrigation ditch, providing a visual reference to this agricultural feature. While the promenade moves people directly from the north and south lengths of the park, it also provides a staging area for future events and festivals near the park's main multi-use pavilion and parking areas. A panoramic walk encircles the great lawn. Combined with the promenade and the east west connections through the lawn, several varying lengths of walkways in quarter mile intervals are provided for individuals using the space for exercise.

The Western Edge

The Western Edge is the park buffer between the existing residential neighborhood to the west and the main activity spaces of the Central Phase. It contains more passive uses, such as walking trails, an exercise circuit, a neighborhood playground, pavilions, an overlook opportunity, and access to the North Pond.

The North Pond is envisioned to not only provide irrigation to the park, but also some recreational and natural opportunities for park users. Options that could be accommodated within the pond include Watchable Wildlife and Fishing is Fun, among other potential recreational opportunities.

The Eastern Edge

The areas east of Indian Wash provide an opportunity for a more natural park experience. Existing and new hiking and biking trails will help people navigate through the natural drainage. The existing disc golf course will be accommodated but re-routed in this area of the park, along with a designated dog park and a bicycle park. The Wash will provide park access for neighboring residential uses.

The Southern Edge

The Southern Edge includes land set aside for a future elementary school, charter elementary school, recreation center, and a South Pond.

Future Elementary and Charter Schools

Matchett Park has been allocated 14 floating acres to house a future elementary school and a charter school. Ten acres have been dedicated to the elementary school and 4 acres to the Independence Academy.

Community Recreation and Aquatic Center

A site has been set aside for a future community recreation and aquatic center. The recreation center includes the provision for an outdoor aquatic park, playground, and tennis, pickleball, and basketball facilities that can be included within the park plan at any time.

Other Park Amenities

The Southern Edge includes a South Pond. It can also accommodate Fishing is Fun, Watchable Wildlife, and other park activities. The pond has a waterfront pavilion and boardwalk to circulate around it. Nearby are volleyball courts and a skateboard park, as well as a space for community gardens.

MAINTENANCE FACILITY RECOMMENDATIONS

It is anticipated that the Matchett Park maintenance facility will serve as a location for City staff assigned to Matchett Park, as well as a satellite location for park operations staff responsible for nearby parks.

Maintenance facility recommendations:

- Staging area for staff, ranging from 10 to 25 full-time and seasonal employees
- Crew leader offices (4), lunchroom, lockers, restroom facilities, storage
- Maintenance shop: (3) vehicle bays at 15 x 30' and tool storage

Maintenance compound recommendations:

- 3 to 4 acres - fenced
- Easy access to and from the property for staff responsibilities off the Matchett Park site. Access to connecting trail and sidewalk systems within the park for utility vehicle transportation required for maintenance operations
- Bulk items storage: soils, fertilizers, wood chips, etc. in large storage bins (8 to 10 total)
- Equipment / storage buildings: (1) 30' x 50' four sided pole barn with one 12' roll up door. (2) 30' x 80' three sided pole barn storage units
- 12' x 20' heated / ventilated chemical storage building attached to the maintenance facility
- Equipment wash bay



There needs to be a connection to I-70 from the north, maybe a frontage road?

I live just off 28 Road north of Patterson. Left turn from 28 Road onto Patterson is already unsafe now. The large GJHA apartment project at 28 ¼ Road will add significantly to the traffic at the 28 Road/Patterson intersection, and Matchett Park will additionally compound that. Currently, to turn east onto Patterson, I take Hawthorne Avenue to the 27 ½ Road light, which adds a mile to each trip. My preference would be a traffic light at the 28 Road/Patterson intersection. Second choice would be providing access onto 28 ¼ Road from Hawthorne Avenue for left-turn entry onto Patterson with a traffic light. The traffic problem is my only negative concern with development of the park. Thank you for giving serious consideration to its impact.

I received a letter guarding the development of Matchett Park which is next to my house. I agree that traffic will be a issue. The gigantic housing project that is currently being built directly accost the street (which I am incredibly unhappy with) from my house is already going to put an huge increase on the traffic coming off of Patterson and 28 1/4 rd. Adding access to the park from that intersection would create a huge nightmare. Around 5 pm traffic gets backed up there for almost a mile every day as is. I think the best access to the park would be to put a light in east of 28 1/4 Rd on Patterson where the access is currently for the Frisbee golf course. I am glad to see the park being developed the hopefully it will help bring my property value back up a little after having a low income housing project put in my front yard.

My name is - and I live in Grand View Subdivision. I can not make the community meeting on June 6, so I thought I would share some of my concerns. I agree with your letter that the two biggest concerns regarding the development of that property is traffic and access. However, when the city approved the low-income housing at 28 1/4 and Patterson they set the tone for more traffic than Patterson can or should carry. Once that housing is full and they have an average of two cars per household I think it will create big problems. My thoughts are to open Hawthorn Street from 28 Road to 28 1/4 Road and stop left hand turns from 28 Road on to Patterson, but every decision has consequences. I think that will hurt the value of the homes on Hawthorn and in fact could reduce value for the entire subdivision. We do not need another park with playground equipment, so a logical suggestion would be a "performing arts" building. How do you finance that project? With the new sales tax increase to be put on the ballot this fall, I am not sure you would get many votes to increase taxes to build this project. I know development is not a concern right now. Are there any opportunities to go East with a road for access to 29 Road?

652 Tamarron Drive, back yard backs up to west side of park, is 100% in favor of the park's development, would like to have most traffic come off of Patterson but recognizes 28 1/4 may have to connect to the north and/or connections from the neighborhood

Leave it agricultural as it is. Sees plenty of people out there right now using it to walk and jog. If it is developed as a park it won't get used like that anymore.

Cortland should be used as an extension and entrance not the three streets that currently dead end at the park, Patterson should also be the other main entrance, neighborhood has lots of streets, looking forward to the park developing just want main part of traffic to come from elsewhere, maybe have walkways enter from current dead end streets not roads

Here are my thoughts about Matchett Park development.

1. Why not leave it as it and have the only park in the city that requires minimum maintenance. Plus the farmer would be able to have a return on his investment. This is the best the park has been in the seven years I've been here.

2. If it is necessary to develop the park with a dog park, it should be placed at the north-east corner of the park. People residing next to the park enjoy walking the park seeing the various wild life and tranquility. If this park is developed with a dog park included then no dogs should be allowed in the rest of the park. Canyon View and Long's Park have the leash law but it is not enforced. There are children playing after dogs leave their calling card which is not healthy for the children. If the laws are not enforced in these two parks what will happen with the development of a new park.

3. I use the park seven days a week for the past six years running, riding a bike and walking with my wife. We do not have any pets but we enjoy watching the crops grow and harvested, observing various wild life and birds.

4. As for the development of 28 1/4 Rd. it will increase traffic noise for our housing area and Grand View. Our house backs up to 28 1/4.

It would be a great decision to have the first truly green park in the city.

My boys and I have lived in Grand View neighborhood 2 blocks from Matchett Park for 8 years.

The wildness of the park was a big deciding factor of us purchasing our home. Things we would NOT want to change with the development of the park are:

1. The natural beauty and wildness of the brush around the ravine
2. The presence of smooth dirt bike trails and jump areas for mountain bikes
3. The presence of the trees
4. The removal of the frisbee golf course.
5. Limiting motor vehicles in the park.

If it is developed out, things we would like to see are:

1. Guard rails and sidewalk along the cliffs of the ravine to make it safer.
2. A good parking lot and park entry from Patterson road or 28 1/4
3. Handicap accessibility to the ravine woodland
4. A play structure with SHADE
5. Rustic Picnic areas similar to what is at Connected Lakes--NOT Canyon View Park
6. Mountain viewing/ birdwatching kiosks, perhaps with telescopes, and with educational plaques about the Grand Mesa, Bookcliffs, history of the Matchett family and ranch, and wildlife found at Matchett. What we would ETREMELY dislike would be for Matchett to be turned into a soccer/other ball field teeming with traffic and thousands of people. Matchett Park is a rare natural beauty smack in the middle of Grand Junction and its beauty and serenity needs to be preserved. In short, I am aware that Grand Junction has one of the highest parks per land area of US cities. This sounds good, but in reality, the vast majority of them have no shade and are boring commercially landscaped splats of land. I see a tremendous need for a park that is more natural. One that can be hiked and wildlife and vegetation explored and learned about. Again, I love the rustic, natural, educational experience of Connected lakes.

We are 52-year-residents of 28 Road, north of Patterson. We have observed the urbanization of Spring Valley and Grand View developments. Both these subdivisions have resulted in desirable neighborhoods, but each contributing to increased traffic on 28 Road and access to Patterson from 28 Road. We welcome thoughtful planning and development of the Matchett property; and we believe any significant development of this property should include extending 28 1/4 Road north to Courtland, so that Spring Valley/Grand View residents and 28 Road residents will have access to a traffic light.

I am writing this letter to express my opinion regarding the development of Matchett Park at Paterson and 28 1/4 Rd. It saddens me to see the park developed as I believe it is possibly the only remaining area in Grand Junction where one can experience nature minimally disrupted by human intervention. I have been walking in the park since it was still fenced with cows in the pastures and a sign at the entrance that read "Please Remember to Close the Gate". Throughout the years I have appreciated the opportunity to observe, in a nature. setting, a variety of wildlife such as fox, coyotes, rabbits, raccoons, ducks, hawks, herons, quail, killdeer, frogs, tadpoles, a and even the skunks. I have watched families of newborn babies grow up without the intrusion of human encroachment. Another example of the many luxuries provided by the park, in its current state, is the smell of blooming or freshly cut alfalfa in the open air, which is perhaps the epitome of "aroma therapy". The area is already designated as a public park, as indicated by the signs at each entrance and is already available for use by the public. It has been the location of many events such as the 5Ks and is routinely used by runners, walkers, bicyclists, and Disk Frisbee players. There are already 3 existing parks in close proximity to Matchett Park. Consequently I believe the best use of the property is to continue to preserve the serenity and solitude it has historically and currently provides.

Traci-

I was out of town this past week so I just wanted to share my thoughts on the Matchett park proposal. I live at the corner of Hawthorne and Tamarron. I don't want any added traffic but I also understand that a connection from 28 1/4 to Hawthorne is probably in the near future. I know that there is nothing that can be done to stop it. But I feel that is enough, don't try to connect 28 1/4 down to Cortland. You will ruin our homes values and our lifestyles. The road would run directly next to our fences which is a very big safety concern. I accept that at some point Hawthorne will be connected, but I along with my neighbors will fight as hard as we can about continuing on down to Cortland. Please keep us up to date about what is going on. It's frustrating to wake up one morning and go outside to find our street dug up and neighbors cars trapped in their driveway because they knew nothing about it.

I live on Grand View Dr, close enough to already be walking around the fields at Matchett Park. I hope you will include trails for walking. It is a beautiful location. My concerns are the same concerns that I had for the low income housing at 28 1/4 and Patterson. The traffic on Patterson is TERRIBLE! I never try to make a left turn at 28Road. I drive over to 27 1/2 and go left with the light. So, I trust you can plan for even more traffic flow that development of Matchett Park would bring. I think it would be a shame to build a thru street on the west side of the park. All the people in the houses on Tamarron would be greatly impacted. Surely an access to Patterson on the east side of the park would serve the same purpose. Thank you for your work in making this a positive experience for the neighborhoods and for our community. When purchased in 1996, someone made a good investment for the people in the Grand Valley. Let's do it right at this point.

Everyday I do about an hour and run the perimeter, out and around the frisbee golf course in the dirt, and back through the field roads. Mud is a problem when it snows - I think it would be good to have a trail that is maintained in bark chips - I don't think asphalt or cement is a good choice with the heave and ho of the ground and the high cost of repair and maintenance. Also hard on the knees! I think that you should have a big pond where people could practice fly casting and dogs could swim - one part of that could be a dog park. I also think that you should have HUGE parcel for community gardening - all set up for irrigation, with capability to divide into 10 x 10 and 20 x 20 plots. This might be a good buffer between the neighbors that back up to the park and the activity zones. It is good for community building and it is good for health. All those apartments there with no ground to garden, it would be good incentive for folks to plant and harvest fruit and veggies. I attended the meeting last week and had a few thoughts I wanted to pass along.</p> <p>*From an aesthetics standpoint I think that any significant structures e.g. Rec Center should be along the West Boundary of the project. In this the views towards the Bookcliffs (especially Mt Garfield) will be unobstructed by the bulk of users at the park.</p> <p>*To me there are really two different and distinct parks in Matchett. The developed park with sports fields, playgrounds and amenities. And, the undeveloped, natural park that exists along Indian Wash. Both of these serve a purpose exclusive to their own. Both can be appreciated and enjoyed by their users.</p> <p>*Views are important I was thinking that up on the hill near Patterson where the house now stands. First let me say that as a newcomer to Grand Junction who arrived 16 months ago, I am very impressed with how this city is involving the public in the design and content of this park. I rent a home near the end of 28 road, so this will be my closest park and the one that I will bring my grandchildren to over future years. I have attended both planning meetings and will also attend the third, if my work schedule permits.

My career since 1969 has been that of a Neonatal ICU nurse, however, I also founded a nationally accredited preschool in OK that was open from 1988-2008. I raised 4 children of my own and I am always interested in any project that gets children playing outdoors, no matter what the weather.

I lived in Tulsa, OK and I believe they now have 22 splash pads. You can get views of some of these amazing parks if you google Black and Gold Park in Glenpool, OK, Jackson Park in Broken Arrow, OK, or Bixby, OK Splash Pad. Two companies have great web sites of many features that can be placed in splash pads or mist parks. These companies are Vortex and Water Odyssey.

I was so surprised to move here and visit with nurses with young children and have them look puzzled when I asked where the city's splash pads were located. In Tulsa, it was a favorite activity for moms of young children. When my 2 1/2 year old g-daughter came to visit she begged to go to the pad every day, even when it rained! We frequented the Bixby splash pad and they had located it in close proximity to a great playground so kids could easily get from one area to the other. Benches and picnic tables were in shaded areas all around so moms could easily keep an eye on their kids and provide lunch or snacks to them.

I would strongly encourage a minimum of two large splash pads at Matchett and I hope they are already in the design plans.

Thank you again for involving concerned citizens and for listening. I LOVE it here.

I wanted to share a couple points I have about the Matchett Park program. I can't help but feel like I'm being led down a path of lesser evils by submitting a vote. I don't feel as though the pros and cons of different uses have been addressed, I don't feel as though the right questions have been asked and a certainly don't feel as though the questions have been answered by the groups of people who should be answering them. I am involved in the Matchett process in hopes of having a destination skatepark built. What I want to see is a destination Skateboard and Bike park. Not as a mixed use, but with multiple features designed to satisfy both bikers and skaters, even inline skaters and scooters with features for varying ages from under 5 and up. Mesa county is a cycling and MTB mecca, a skiing and snowboarding hub and a park of that type could be used year round by a broad audience while only using 2-3 acres. What I don't want to see is another soccer or football field as I can count 4 of them within five miles of that location. I want the park to be landscaped professionally with trees and rocks, to be lit until 10pm daily and to not be hidden from main view so as to ensure it is not used for vandalism as virtually all of the parks built in the 90's were due to poor design, poorer execution and the idea that these sports are not mainstream (anyone follow the Olympic ratings by sport, the Xgames, Dew Tour, Rev Tour or any of the rest of the media charged mainstream sports which have come a long way in their short lifespan). These are just my opinions, but I feel they are some food for thought that has been overlooked. I was optimistic that a park consulting firm would start the process by identifying the needs of the community, presenting pros and cons and related statistics of similar concepts in existing parks both around the state and country, and give an opportunity to present cases for and against. Needless to say, my expectations are far different than what I have seen thus far. Matchett Park is a completely new park. A (in relative terms) giant park for the city of Grand Junction and Mesa County. If you were to begin by identifying the needs of Grand Junction and Mesa county, looking at the recreational use trends for the area, and identifying the wants and needs, you would see a giant hole where there should be both a rec. center and a modern skatepark. Both of which are being built in virtually every town and city in the state, but has somehow historically been overlooked here. I can make the case that destination vs neighborhood skatepark puts heads in beds and will have a much longer lifespan, broader usage, and the ability to be used for education, events, etc. vs a skate plaza that has a very focused singular use, but that conversation is for another time. Where my frustration lies is this. I understand there are neighbors and those neighbors fit a demographic that has on average a 10 year use of that park (based upon the data of participants in attendance 71 years of age or older). The same neighbors are being polled about what they want to see, and every one of them is answering with a list of uses exactly like every other empty park in this area. Tennis Courts, Football fields, swimming pools, and soccer fields can all be found within a five mile radius of the park, have nothing to offer, are absolute waste of natural resources thus cost more money to maintain, and are not needed. Additionally, the demographic voting for these uses has a stronger vote by way of geographic location and will probably be the least concentrated demographic in terms of park usage. This style of collecting data from neighbors and poll them on what they want to see is not an accurate representation of what the community wants or needs. Doing this also comes with a bias which I honestly am fairly surprised with. Meanwhile, the largest growth within a five mile radius of that park is the college which has no representation at the meetings once so ever. I feel that although it is probably already a missed opportunity, the consulting firm should change gears, present a case of what is working and popular at other parks throughout the state, market the poll to a much more broad demographic including businesses which specialize in recreation, CMU and their outdoor and sports programs, High Schools, Powderhorn ski area, Bike Shops, etc. and help to build a park that will benefit the city of Grand Junction rather than yet another yard to cut and water to be used three months a year on Saturdays only. Finally, want to make the point that 205 acres, with roughly 10-15 acres allocated for school facilities almost guarantees football/soccer fields and need not be part of the Matchett Park plan, and these 205 acres will be paid for by taxpayers, of Grand Junction, grants for specific uses and probably some by the Colorado Lottery, not the immediate neighbors. Thus, I believe there should be equal weight given to poll by demographic rather than geographic location. Please let me know if you have any questions or if any of my ideas need clarification.

I wanted to share some information with you regarding A skatepark at matchett.</p> <p>The first thing you and your committee must understand is the situation that the skateboarding community is currently in. The city currently has 3 small/medium sized skateparks that are suffering from not only poor design, but lack of maintenance. The graffiti riddled parks of west lake and eagle rim do not make them very presentable(for most), and for some people like me they actually become hazardous at times. I already told you how i am working with the city on how we can make the current parks safer but that was never our committees goal. The western slope is home to a huge amount of outdoor enthusiasts, many of them participating in action sports. Skateboarding unfortunately is very suppressed. The parks (even in the surrounding areas in the valley) are suffering, and the industry does not recognize Grand Junction for skateboarding at all even though we have professionals living here!</p> <p>We have fought and have been fighting for a park that will not only satisfy the needs of everyone in the city but also create revenue. Thus, we envision a destination skatepark. Something that will attract skaters and travelers from all over Colorado if not the country.</p> <p>Arvada skatepark is what we have been basing our concepts from. <p>Dear Mr. Doody,</p> <p>As neighbors on the west side of the Matchett property, we are very excited about the creative and exciting plans for the development of the proposal for a park and possible recreation center in this part of the city. We know you are interested in community comments since you are part of the Parks and Rec Board, and hope that you will be supportive of such an important feature for our valley. Newcomers we meet are always so surprised that we do not already have a rec center, and long term residents have been watching smaller communities all around us develop and actively support such centers all over the western slope. My husband and I have worked in careers that have put us in touch with many families since we moved to GJ in 1975 and we have served on many boards and community coalitions. Almost every committee and task force studying community health and well being has recommended more family and youth activity centers to help overcome the negative influences underlying such things as juvenile delinquency, drug and alcohol problems, crime, suicide, teen pregnancy, and risks to mental and physical health. Economic difficulties since 2007 have put off the steady stream of efforts of the past years to reactivate the increasing interest for building a recreation center. <p>Hi Traci,</p> <p>I did a walk through Matchett Park.</p> <p>The only habitat is in the wash. This isn't great or unique habitat. It's principal value in my view is it provides some connectivity for some of the less-urban species that still are present in urbanized areas. By that I mean, American Kestrels, Western screech-owls and great-horned owls. These probably use that area on occasion to hunt and roost. There are nests of these species nearby (~29rd and F 1/2, the canal area north of Orchard [off of Ashley etc.]). We know keeping these birds in town relies somewhat on their ability to move around without having to fly on busy streets. If the wash is left vegetated; they would probably still do so after park development. So, my personal opinion is that park development is not going to change conditions for wildlife all that much. If some re-vegetation is done, and a wash-side trail is developed, you may improve it. Such improvements will probably be marginal for wildlife but may be significant for aesthetics.</p> <p>Those species I mentioned, may nest in the large trees that are bounded essentially at 29 road and at the north end of the park area. If we had nest boxes or baskets for some of those species in the large trees, they would be used--and there may be natural cavities that are used now. Those larger trees are probably not on city property, but their use for nesting may depend somewhat on maintaining some habitat within the wash.</p> <p>The area is already heavily impacted by use. There was someone with a revolver chasing birds or rock squirrels while I was walking there. He was running up and down the little swales shooting at something. There's obviously a lot of kids riding their bikes up and down the swales as well. That type of use will probably continue (except for the gun, I hope) or increase after park development. So again, I don't see park development per se impacting the area beyond what is already happening, unless the vegetation connectivity were eliminated.</p> <p>Where there is permanent water, it is possible a few red-winged blackbirds or a song sparrow or two could nest. Both of these species are common in similar habitat.</p> <p>Finally, this is not an expert nor an official opinion of Grand Valley Audubon. If you ever need formal comments or assistance from us, I will get a response from the board. In any event, I hope my comments are helpful. Let me know if you have any questions.</p>	1-Mar

<p>Hi Traci, It was nice talking with you at the informational meeting at Faith Heights Church. I was offering the idea to incorporate a Cross Country Course for equestrians into your plan.</p> <p>I was able to walk the area to see if the topography would be suited to a cross country course and was very pleasantly surprised to find that it would definitely lend itself to that purpose. In fact, there is so much natural material at hand as well, that it would serve two purposes. First, the area could use some "cleaning up" both with trash pickup and clearing of downed trees and loose materials from some of the existing jump obstacles. This would make the area much safer even for pedestrian traffic. Secondly, many of these downed trees could be converted into jumps. <p>Hi Traci,</p> <p>I'd like to thank you for all the hard work you & your team have put into the planning of Matchett Park. It's going to be beautiful. My husband & I have also given a lot of thought to the new park & have a couple of requests we want to share with you. First, the foot traffic by our house has greatly increased since the meetings started and we know it will keep increasing as people utilize the new park. We have lived in this house for seven years and never needed or wanted a fence because we loved the open area. But now we are having a lot of trouble with people & dogs in our yard. Dogs are supposed to be leashed, of course, but most are not and they run into my yard and poop and trample my flowers and chase the wild rabbits that are here. Also, people (children especially) can't tell where the park begins and ends. Are you going to fence the perimeter of the park with gates for access for the existing houses? I think that should be the parks responsibility.</p> <p>Secondly, when we spoke to the guy at the meeting about reducing the noise factor, he suggested moving the walking trail by my house to the other side of the water retention pond since there really isn't any reason that people need to be walking so close to the houses in my neighborhood. My neighbors and I strongly agree with that. Would you consider moving the trail to the other side of the pond and away from the houses? He also said that planting trees on berms around the perimeter would help reduce the noise. That would be greatly appreciated and I would ask that you keep in mind our sunset views when deciding the height of the trees you plant. If you or others think of any additional noise or people intrusion reduction ideas I would love to hear them as these are our greatest concerns.</p> <p>Lastly, on the new plan there are two capital "P's" directly above the lot where I plan to build my new house and a note about parking. <p>Traci,</p> <p>I am the president of the Grand Valley Pony Club here in Grand Junction. We are part of a national organization, the United States Pony Clubs and currently have ten members who are all very active in eventing and equestrian sports. We currently have to travel great distances to compete and the closest cross country course to practice on is in Rifle and Basalt, Colorado.</p> <p>I was not aware until speaking with Susan Lauffenberger that the Matchett property was being developed. As you are probably aware, Dr. Matchett was an avid equestrian and eventer. What a great way to honor someone with a park and an area where young riders could learn, compete and train closer to home.</p> <p>When the Mesa County Fairgrounds was holding the open houses regarding plans for that property, I went and spoke with the developer about adding a cross country course. We went over the plans and there was no feasible way to add a quality course onto the existing fairground property. With the added barns and arenas that are planned for the fairgrounds, it makes sense to add a cross country facility to attract people from outlying areas.</p> <p>I would ask that the city consider providing an area where local equestrians can train safely. <p>Paul,</p> <p>I want to thank you for the time and consideration you have given my proposal for the Matchett Park entrance to be located at Legends Way, rather than aligned with 28 1/2 Road. I will definitely look at the literature you sent explaining the rational behind signalized intersection spacing. As I mentioned yesterday, the signal isn't as critical to me as just having the entrance to the park located at the Legends Way intersection for the following reasons:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. It will utilize an already existing intersection and won't add an additional high traffic intersection on Patterson Road at 28 1/2 Road 2. And as I explained, the main reason I have for considering an intersection on Patterson at Legends Way rather than at 28 1/2 Road is, if it was just a simple low traffic access to a small park, it probably wouldn't be so concerning. However, it is going to be a high traffic intersection servicing not only the main access to a large park, but also a community center and two schools. With the current design preference (Attached), all traffic to the community center and park will have to pass between both schools. It just make sense to me, for the safety of the children, and the schools in general, to have the Legends Way intersection allow for main access, to the park and community center, travel to the east of the schools, and then siphon off traffic to the schools, allowing for limited and specific traffic to those destinations; and hopefully a safer situation for the children. <p>One thing occurred to me after our discussion, which I do have a question about. With the schools located right on Patterson Road, will that create a daily 20 MPH travel zone for the school arrival and dismissal periods?</p> <p>Anyway, I'm copying everyone on my reply, so that if I have the opportunity to speak with any of them in the future, they will have some background on my concerns; or, if they have any questions or comments for me. I'm also including the Free Press reporter who also received some of my concerns yesterday.</p> <p>I realize nothing is set in stone until final implementation. I base this on the inaccurate radii on all transitions and poor traffic flow. I would be happy to volunteer my time in any way for either the City or County if we truly are thinking seriously about skateboard parks.</p> <p>I can help with:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. PR between city officials and the skateboard community 2. Cost/benefit analysis as well as demographic and participation data for the sport (these numbers can be a surprise for many) 3. Design analysis and contracting (I have connections to the two best park building companies in the world). 4. The area designated for the Frisbee golf course combined with the nature walk area could also contain the equestrian course. My thinking is that that area could easily be shared. I realize that it may involve some discussion with the Frisbee golf group to make this work for both...but I certainly think it's a idea to seriously consider.</p> <p>Finding a location with a the amount of land needed to have a cross country course is very difficult. Even at the lowest level of competition, it requires at least a distance of a mile and goes up from there. <p>Hello Traci!</p> <p>I have been informed about the possibility of an access road to the new Matchett Park off of 29 road at F 1/2.</p> <p>This concerns me for several reasons, those being;</p> <p>#1. the impact to the Darla Jean subdivision residents especially for the residents directly adjacent to F1/2.</p> <p>#2.the impact on our subdivision irrigation system pump house system located just east of the chase residence and directly adjacent to the "F1/2 road " path.</p> <p>In addition to this particular access also concerned with the access to the Bike Park at Music St. This area proposed for bikes is alarming due to the already high incident of disorderly young bike enthusiasts and others who have historically used this and the Darla Jean Park access to indulge in illicit drug activities in conjunction with the Patterson access to facilitate their activities.</p> <p>I voiced concern that the Matchett Park should have limited access road as in two at most to lessen the impact to all neighborhoods involved and to limit the versatility for concerning activities.
