The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, no; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 234.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The depository bonds of the United States Bank & Trust Co., and the Bank of Grand Junction having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the said bonds be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
