

Grand Junction, Colorado
February 16, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 9th were read and approved.

The petition of A. R. Wilson, G. L. Walker, G. F. Rock, and others, filed with the Clerk on February 10th, was presented and read. The petitioners protested against the taking effect of Ordinance No. 233, an ordinance concerning Sunday closing and passed by the Council on January 12, 1915, and asked that the said ordinance be repealed or submitted to a vote of the people, as provided by law.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the petition was referred to the City Attorney and City Clerk for verification of signatures.

A communication from the J. W. Milne Transfer & Storage Co., in reference to the hauling of city freight was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the city hauling, except carload lots, be lot to the J. W. Milne Transfer & Storage Co. for the next year, beginning this date.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, submitting a list of the delinquent water accounts, which according to the city ordinances should be shut off. The list submitted showed that 218 water users were delinquent one quarter; 49 delinquent two quarters; 8 delinquent 3 quarters; 3 delinquent 4 quarters, and one delinquent 2 years and one quarter.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication and list was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The report of S. R. Schaeffer, certified public accountant, on the examination of the books, records and accounts of The Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company insofar as they relate to the telephone plant at Grand Junction, was submitted to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was received and ordered palced on file.
