

Grand Junction, Colorado  
March 10, 1915.

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 10 o'clock a.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

The Council took up for consideration the several bids for furnishing 2,500 barrels of cement, more or less, for the proposed Paving and Sidewalk District No. 5, opened and read at yesterday's meeting.

The bid of the Gibson Lumber & Mercantile Co. being found to be the lowest, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the said bid of the Gibson Lumber & Mercantile Co. be accepted, subject to the final formation of the proposed paving and sidewalk district, and cement to comply with the specifications.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that a committee of two be appointed to confer with the School Board of District No. 1 in reference to exchange of lots with the City.

The motion carried, and the Mayor thereupon appointed Commissioners Holmburg and Rankin to serve as said committee.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
