

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 18, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carson.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 11th were read and approved.

A communication from the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, submitting a list of delinquent water accounts, was read. The list showed 165 accounts delinquent for one quarter; 32 accounts for two quarters; 9 accounts for three quarters; 2 accounts for four quarters, and three accounts delinquent for five quarters.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication and list of delinquents was referred to the Mayor, owing to the absence of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The following bills having been approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk;

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Cutting of Weeds and Brush and the removal of Weeds, Brush and Rubbish," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Cherrington, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Cutting of Weeds and Brush and the Removal of Weeds, Brush and Rubbish," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 236.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the cost of construction of the new Fire and Police Building was to be derived from the sale of the old building at Colorado avenue and 5th Street and a 1- mill levy for the year 1914, and

WHEREAS, it appears from the records on the books of the Commissioner of Finance that the cost of said building has exceeded the revenue derived from said one-mill levy and the amount received from the sale of the said old building to the amount of \$388.15, and the Fire House Construction Fund on the books of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies shows an

overdraft of said amount of \$388.15; be it, therefore,

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be hereby instructed to draw a warrant on the Fire Fund for \$257.93, and a warrant on the Police Fund for \$130.22, both warrants drawn payable to the Fire House Construction Fund, and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies credit said amounts to said Fire House Construction Fund, so that said overdraft of \$388.15 be taken up and said account be balanced and closed.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Mayor Cherrington recommended to the Council the appointment John E. Blake as a regular Fireman, the said Blake having taken and passed the civil service examination, as required by ordinance.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the recommendations of the Mayor be concurred in and that John E. Blake be appointed as a regular Fireman to serve from and after this date.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council present, and John E. Blake was declared duly appointed as a regular Fireman.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council then adjourned.
