## Grand Junction, Colorado June 15, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 8th were read and approved.

The petition of E. D. Atkinson and others, asking the City to open road or alley along the north side of Block 2 in Mobley's Subdivision, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways and the City Attorney.

J. Smith having asked for a permit to erect an illuminated sign in front of the Argyle Hotel and having submitted plan and dimensions of same, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the permit be granted upon the payment of the fee of one dollar to the City Treasurer.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Alfred Bale having asked for permit to operate an ice cream and soda pop stand at or near the City Park, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the matter of granting such permit be referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty, with power to act.
