

Grand Junction, Colorado
June 25, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioners Rankin and Carson.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on Paving and Sidewalk District No. 5 Fund for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A communication from J. N. Nedwedick, Superintendent Rio Grande Junction Railway, calling attention to the large difference in the amount of said Company's water bill for April, 1915, as compared with the corresponding month of last year, apparently due to the unreliable condition of the meter, and asking the Council to accept a settlement of account for months of April and May, 1915, on the same basis as last year's reading, or a total of \$836.28 for both months, was read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that, owing to the unreliable condition of the water meter, the same being out of order an estimated bill for water furnished the Rio Grande Junction Railway Company for the months of April and May, 1915, be rendered, based on the reading for same months of 1914, being a total of \$836.28 for both months.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called,

voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council then adjourned.
