

Grand Junction, Colorado  
August 3, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 27th were read and approved.

B. F. Griffith appeared before the Council on behalf of the owner of the old Mesa County Fair Grounds and asked for free water for said grounds, the same as formerly when Fairs were held there.

The matter was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the report was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

#### RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Grand Junction & Grand River Valley Railway was assessed in 1914 on 6.4 miles in the City of Grand Junction when it should have been assessed on only 4.67 miles, the City tax being \$427.52, which is about \$140 too high, and

WHEREAS, the tax on the assessment of said company in the town of Fruita was \$113.56 short, and

WHEREAS, the error may be corrected by authorizing the County Treasurer to pay \$113.56 of said \$427.52 to the town of Fruita; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County Treasurer of Mesa County be and he is hereby authorized to pay \$113.50 of the said \$427.52 which has been paid or is to be paid by said County to the Town of Fruita.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
