

Grand Junction, Colorado
August 31, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 24th and adjourned session of August 25th were read and approved.

On the petition of L. J. Campbell and others in reference to the property described as lots 31 to 36 inclusive, in block 36, Mayor Cherrington, to whom the petition had been referred, reported that the owner of the property had positively refused to do anything to remedy the conditions thereof.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the report was accepted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase 1070 feet, more or less, of 10-inch sewer pipe for First street sewer.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that B. W. Vedder be given the use of the City trenching machine until November 1st, at \$10.00 per day, provided he furnish a bond or guaranty to return the machine to the City on or before said date.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
