Grand Junction, Colorado September 7, 1915.

The matter was taken up and discussed by the Council, and it was then moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Council appropriate \$125 out of the General Fund for making an exhibit of Grand Junction manufactured products at the International Soil-Products Exposition, to be held in Denver, September 26 to October 10, 1915; provided, the Commissioners of Mesa County give a like amount of county funds for the same purpose.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Communications from the Forest Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, in reference to the agreement made June 16th with the said Department for the protection of the watershed of Kannah Creek, were read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communications, together with a copy of the agreement, were ordered placed on file.
