

Grand Junction, Colorado  
September 28, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 21st were read and approved.

The petition of A. C. Foster and others, asking that a six inch water main be laid on North avenue from Seventh street east to Twelfth street, and that arc lights be ordered placed at the corner of North avenue and Twelfth street and the corner of North avenue and Ninth street, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the petition was ordered placed on file.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The resignation of Ellsworth A. Beatty as civil service commissioner was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the resignation was accepted.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Mrs. H. C. Olsen, owner of the property at 929 South Fifth street, desires to connect said property with the sewer in Sewer District No. 3; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said Mrs. Olsen be permitted to connect said property with said sewer district on the payment of \$20.00; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the said \$20.00, when received, be credited to Sewer District No. 3.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson,

yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
