Grand Junction, Colorado October 25, 1915.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The City Clerk reported to the Council that L. M. K. Phillips, F. A. Hoisington and C. C. Knowles, who had filed the petition submitting a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisement and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now Operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction," had requested the withdrawal of said petition and upon the advice of the City Attorney the same had been returned to the petitioners.

It was thereupon moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the question of submitting the proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisement and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction," be withdrawn and that the said proposed ordinance be not placed on the ballot for the coming regular municipal election.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council then adjourned.
