

Grand Junction, Colorado
December 22, 1915.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carson.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the ordinance levying the water assessment made an assessment on each lot in Block 7 in Canon's subdivision in the City of Grand Junction, and as only lots 1 and 32 in said block are adjacent to a water main and subject to assessment, the assessment against lots 2 to 31 inclusive was an error, and

WHEREAS, lots 9 to 16 inclusive were sold by the County Treasurer for failure to pay such assessment and lots 2 to 8 inclusive and 17 to 31 inclusive have paid said assessment; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies is hereby authorized and instructed to have released the Certificate of Sale on said lots 9 to 16 inclusive and to refund on demand to the owners of said lots 2 to 8 inclusive and lots 17 to 31 inclusive on which the assessment has been paid, the amount of the assessments paid thereon.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea; the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that unless some arrangement be made in the matter, satisfactory to the Council, for the payment of back water rent, the Mayor, acting Commissioner of Water and Sewers, be and hereby is instructed to shut off the water from the Oasis Mutual Water Co. to-day.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council then adjourned.
