

Grand Junction, Colorado
February 1, 1916

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 25th and adjourned session of January 31st were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the report was referred to the Mayor.

John Fuite having made application for renewal of license as master plumber and his bond having been examined and approved by the city attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that a plumbing license be granted to the said John Fuite.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The depository bond of The Bank of Grand Junction having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the said bond be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

WHEREAS, notice has been given in the city official paper, as required by ordinance, to the owners of real estate affected, that the Council would meet on January 18, 1916, at four o'clock p. m., for the purpose of considering objections in writing to the assessment of the real eastate fronting on city water mains; and

WHEREAS, no objections to the assessment of any lots fronting on city water mains were filed on said date, nor have any objections been filed since; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the assessment roll prepared by the City Treasurer be and the same is hereby confirmed.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
