Grand Junction, Colorado March 14, 1916

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 7th were read and approved.

Mrs. C. B. Rich appeared before the Council on behalf of the Orchard Mesa Cemetery Association and asked assistance from the City for the maintenance of the cemeteries.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council agree to pay for \$100 worth of labor in the care and maintenance of the Orchard Mesa cemeteries.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order order 1350 feet of 3-4 inch Genuine Wrought Iron pipe for extension of water lines in Cottonwood Park.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Commissioner Rankin now reported present and made a verbal report to the Council as to the condition of the Kannah Creek pipe line, and stated that immediate repairs were necessary in certain places on the line.

Messrs. Moorhead and Williamson of the Midland Trail Association appeared before the Council in reference to the issue of the Midland Trail log-book, and asked the Council to take space in same for city publicity and subscribe for 50 or 100 copies of said book.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the Council take up for consideration the matter of the Midland Trail log-book at the next regular meeting. The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council then adjourned.
