Grand Junction, Colorado April 25, 1916

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, With Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 18th were read and approved.

C. F. Ferbrache appeared before the Council and asked for permit to erect a concrete building in rear of laundry on Rood avenue between Sixth and Seventh Streets, with 8-inch wall.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that C. F. Ferbrache be granted permit to erect a 14 x 20 x 15 building on Rood avenue, in rear of laundry, with 8inch concrete wall.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the report was referred to the Auditor.

The following quarterly reports having been examined and approved by the Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same were, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file: Commissioner of Public Affairs, Commissioner of Water and Sewers, Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty, and City Clerk and Auditor.

The bill of Scott Heckman (#21,740) for \$35.00, balance due for services in assisting city attorney in revising city ordinances, having been approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bill be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the General Fund for the said amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council then adjourned.
