

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 20, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present; Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 13th were read and approved.

Communications from John Fuite and S. C. Ashley were read and referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

A communication from Chas. Decker, manager of the Rex Amusement Co., was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from C. F. Boyd, James Purcell and other cigarette dealers, requesting the Council to reduce the license for the sale of cigarettes from \$50.00 to \$20.00 per year, was read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication was laid on the table.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that whereas the Council feels that the concerts given in Whitman Park by the Grand Junction Choral Society have not been satisfactory as a chorus, owing to the lack of voices, the Council request the said Choral Society to discontinue the concerts after Sunday, June 25th next.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council fix a price of \$175.00 on the old fire boll, and that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to sell the same at the said price.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the Council offer one cent per pound for Japanese (yellow top) clever, with roots, brought to the City Weigher at Fire House from this date to and including July 15, 1916, and that in addition prizes for the largest number of pounds brought be given as follows: First prize, \$3,00; second prize, \$1.50; third prize, 50 cents.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
