

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 30, 1916.

Pursuant to adjournment of the previous day, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 9 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present; Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Sprinkling Hours," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Sprinkling Hours," be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and ordered published.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 251.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned until 4 o'clock p. m.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction reconvened, pursuant to adjournment, at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

Bids for the houses and boilers at the old pumping plant were opened and read as follows:

W. T. Vedder--Bid \$60 for two 80-horse power boilers with stack; \$60 for 4-room house and one room house.

H. Tupper for J. F. Baughman--Bid \$60 for four room house.

J. W. Watson--Bid \$35 for four-room house and \$10 for one-room house.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bids be laid on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
