The bids for houses and material at the old pumping plant, laid on the table at a former meeting of the Council, were taken up for consideration.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the bid of J. F. Baughman of \$60.00 for the four-room house, and the bid of J. W. Watson of \$10.00 for the one-room house, be accepted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
