

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 26, 1916.

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at four o'clock p. m., in City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 18 were read and approved.

Mr. T. C. Baldwin appeared before the Council and stated that he had discontinued his business of employment agency and asked that the Council refund a portion of the license fee paid for license to September 30, 1916.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the City Treasurer be instructed to remit \$5.00 to T. C. Baldwin on account of fee paid for employment agency license.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Mr. George Mason having bought out the business of Edward Johnson, cement contractor, he asked that the license issued to the said Johnson be transferred to him.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the cement contractor's license issued to Edward Johnson be transferred to George Mason.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

A communication from Chas. A. Giaque, giving report of work of the Boys' Municipal League, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the communication was received and ordered placed on file.

The bond of George Mason as cement contractor having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly reports of the City Clerk and Auditor and the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty having been examined and

approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same were on motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Highways has recommended to the Council that a cement sidewalk be ordered constructed in front of the lots hereafter described, and

WHEREAS, the Council deems that the construction of the sidewalk is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is ordered constructed in accordance with the provisions of the city ordinances in front of the following described lots, namely: Lots 11 and 12, in Block 108, and Lots 1 and 2 in Block 109, City of Grand Junction; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the owners of the above described lots to construct a cement sidewalk in front of said described lots within thirty days after receipt of said notice.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution.

Whereas

Warrant #4755-\$4 #1 issued in 1909, Warrant ##5241--\$1.00 issued in 1910, Warrant 635--7.00 issued in 1912, Warrant #19977 \$1.50 issued in 1915 do not appear from the records as ever having been presented for payment; and Warrant #20442--\$2.50, and Warrant #20754--\$2.50, issued in 1915 have never been taken up and were probably issued in error, and

Whereas,

It is desirable to dispose of these items and clear these old accounts; be it therefore

Resolved

By the City Council of the city of Grand Junction that these six warrants be, and the same are hereby declared cancelled, and that the City Clerk be instructed to show such cancellation on his records.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioner voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Moving Picture Shows," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the proposed ordinance be laid on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Mayor be instructed to notify Mr. John Lowell, U. S. Forest Supervisor, to inspect reservoirs on Grand Mesa and patroll Kannah Creek water shed, under the terms of the contract heretofore entered into with the U.S. government, for the months of August and September.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried. On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
