

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 2d, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 25th and adjourned session of July 26th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

A communication from the Grand Junction Choral Society was received and read, stating that the society would be unable to continue the concerts in Whitman Park through the month of August. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from John H. Lowell, Jr., U. S. Forest Supervisor, was read, stating that Arthur. J. Arney of Collbran had been employed as special patrolman for the Kannah Creek water shed for the months of August and September in accordance with the agreement between the City and the U.S. Department of Agriculture; said special patrolman to receive a salary of \$75.00 per month.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the American Association of Park-Superintendents in reference to the annual meeting of the association was read and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Sections 6 and 7 of Ordinance No. 187 and Repealing Ordinance No. 151," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Amending Sections 6 and 7 of Ordinance No. 187 and Repealing Ordinance No. 151," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 252.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

In reference to the matter of the water rental at 727 White avenue, previously referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, Commissioner Rankin recommended that a rebate of \$24.00 on account of over-charge.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the water rental and charge for grease trap cleaning for the property at 727 White avenue, on account of over-charge for past year, be rebated for the last half of 1916 and all for the year 1917.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council then adjourned.
