

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 5, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 29th and adjourned session of August 30th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Mayor.

E. L. Moore having purchased the dairy of A. C. Schwenker asked that the permit to sell milk issued to Mr. Schwenker be transferred to him.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the permit to sell milk for the current year issued to A. C. Schwenker be transferred to E. L. Moore.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.
