

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 6, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners responded as present at roll call: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for an Emergency Appropriation for the Maintenance of the City Water Works," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and ordered published in the official newspaper of the city.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 253.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council then adjourned.
