The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 11 o'clock a.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Licensing of Motor Busses and Passenger Vehicles Running on the Streets of the City of Grand Junction," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, no; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be authorized to enter into an agreement with B. W. Vodder for the use of the city trenching machine, the said Vodder to pay \$12.50 per day of eight hours not to exceed 10 hours, #5 from time machine is put to actual use until time of return to the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
