

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 30, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 3 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Licensing of Motor Busses and Passenger Vehicles Running on the Streets of the City of Grand Junction," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Licensing of Motor Busses and Passenger Vehicles," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioner voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, nay; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 254.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to place an order with the Wallace Tierman Co. Inc., for a Manual Control Chlorinator, Direct Food Type A, for the City water works, the price to be \$500.00, f.o.b. New York City.

The motion being put, upon call roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
