

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 24, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 17th were read and approved.

Messrs. Ashley, Laurent and Davidson appeared before the Council in reference to the construction of a new road over Purdy Mesa to the Kannah Creek intake.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the matter of the proposed new road was referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Meters," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Meters," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 255.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council then adjourned.
