

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 28, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Rankin, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Rankin, Vorbeck, and Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington and Blackstone.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 21st were read and approved.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, it is the opinion of the Council that the following water users should be required to have installed meters to measure the water used by them and that they be charged for water by motor rates, the said users being

Therefore, be it Resolved, that the said water users be required to make the necessary deposit and the necessary steps be taken to install motors, and that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers is hereby instructed to so notify the said users.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
