

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 12, 1916.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 5th were read and approved.

The petition of N. E. Ault and others, asking that the Council have removed seven cottonwood trees now standing in the middle of the alley running from First to Spruce street, between West White and West Rood ave., was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the petition was referred to the Board of Forestry.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was referred to the Mayor.

A communication from the members of the Fire Department, asking for an increase in salaries, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was laid on the table.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
