All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Mayor be instructed to have the police officers of the city occasionally require teamsters hauling coal to weigh their loads on the city scales so as to check the weight of the same.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
