## Grand Junction, Colorado January 30, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 23d were read and approved.

The bill of the Public Utilities Commission for Vol. 2 of Reports for \$2.50 (#23,145) having been approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the General Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

The official bond of R. E. Meserve, as City Engineer, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be accepted and placed on file.

The motion carried.

In the matter of the elimination of the Independent Ranchers' ditch, the Mayor appointed Commissioners Rankin and Blackstone to confer with a like committee of the Chamber of Commerce.

The bond of H. Goodman, junk dealer, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
