

Grand Junction, Colorado
February 6, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 30th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The petition of J. A. White and others, asking that an are light be placed at the intersection of Grand Avenue and Tenth street, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the petition was referred to the Mayor.

The depository bond of the Bank of Grand Junction having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.
