All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The depository bond of the United States Bank & Trust Co. having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, accepted by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Electric Light Co. be requested to blow the city siren every Sunday morning at 8 o'clock for the next six

weeks, for the purpose of calling attention to the Sunday schools.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
