## Grand Junction, Colorado April 10, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vorbeck.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 3 and adjourned sessions of April 4, 5, 6, and 7, were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The contract with the Castell Lumber Co. for furnishing the City with 3,000 barrels of cement, more or less, was read.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the contract with the Castell Lumber Co. for 3,000 barrels of cement, more or less, as read be accepted, and that the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed to execute the same on behalf of the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.
