

Grand Junction, Colorado
April 24, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

The report of the audit of the City's books and accounts by S. R. Schaeffer, certified public accountant, was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following bills having been examined and approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The Mayor recommended the placing of an arc light at the intersection of Colorado avenue and Thirteenth street.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Mayor's recommendation be concurred in and an arc light be ordered placed at the intersection of Colorado avenue and Thirteenth street.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
