## Grand Junction, Colorado June 19, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners responded as present at roll call: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 6th and special meeting of June 16 were read and approved.

The city water having been shut off his premises for using water out side of sprinkling hours, Judge Morrison appeared before the Council and made an explanation of why the water had been so used and promised to comply with the requirements of the ordinance hereafter.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the explanation of Judge Morrison be accepted and the water again turned on his premises.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

B. W. Vedder appeared before the Council and asked to rent the City's trenching machine for use in the town of Silt.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the city trenching machine be rented to B. W. Vedder at \$10.00 per day for actual use, machine to be returned in as good repair as when rented, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A communication from the George Pierce Testing Laboratories, offering to test cement for 3 cents per bbl., was read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the George Pierce Testing Laboratories be employed to test the cement to be used for Sidewalk District No. 2.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted

as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Book Cliff Railroad Company desires to connect with Sewer District No. 4 of the City of Grand Junction, said sewer connection to be made with a building on its property, East of Main Street and South of Rice Street, in the City of Grand Junction, said building being known as the Book Cliff Railroad Depot.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that in consideration of the payment by the said Company to the City of Grand Junction, for use of the said Sewer District, of the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15), the said Company is hereby permitted to connect its said building with the said sewer; the said company shall not, however, be permitted to have further sewer connections or rights except in the said building as herein specified.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
