

Grand Junction, Colorado
July 17, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the che chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 10 and special meeting of July 14 were read and approved.

A communication from Gov. Gunter in reference to the organization of companies of home guards was read to the Council.

The following reports were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin the same were referred to the auditor:

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs,
Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers,
Quarterly Report of the City Treasurer, and
Quarterly Report of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

The Quarterly Report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Pat Listen is the owner of the west half of Lot 13 in Block 6, in Mobley's subdivision to the city of Grand Junction and desires to connect said real estate with the sewer in District No. 4; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the said real estate may have sewer connections with the sewer in said district No. 4 by the payment of \$16.00.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, D. McKinnon, who lives on the corner of Colorado avenue and 12th street, in the city of Grand Junction, is endangering the health of the people in that neighborhood by the use of a privy, and

WHEREAS, the said McKinnon is, through long sickness, is unable to connect his premises with the sewer; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be and he is hereby instructed to have installed a hopper toilet in said privy, which shall be connected with said sewer, and to take a note to said city for the cost of said work.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
