The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the matter of the fulfillment of the lease of the Palmer Park tract by Henry Patterson be turned over to the City Attorney for action.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
