## Grand Junction, Colorado September 11, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m, in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 4th were read and approved.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

## Resolution.

Whereas,

Lots 17-18-19-20-21-24 & 25 in Carpenter's 2nd. Add. to Grand Junction have been sold to the City of Grand Junction for unpaid Special Assessments made for water main frontage, for which tax sale certificates#16995-16996-17008-17009-17010-17011 & 17012 are in the hands of the Commissioner of Finance & Supplies; said certificates being for a total principal amount of \$17.85, and;

Whereas,

There are further tax sales standing against these said lots, all of which with interest and penelties and costs will aggregate an amount nearly, if not fully, all said lots are worth, and;

Whereas,

Philip Salvatti, the owner of said lots desires to buy up all outstanding tax sales on these lots, provided interest and penelties are waived by the holders of said certificates; be it therefore,

Resolved,

That the Commissioner of Finance & Supplies be authorized and instructed to accept for the city from Mr. Salvati, the principal sum of \$17.85 as a full settlement for tax sale certificates above described.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to place an order for one steel filing section with cabinets and drawers as described in requisition read, the price to be \$281.50, delivered and set up in city vault.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
