The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Rankin, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that Geo. W. Armstrong be appointed a counting judge for Precinct No. 10 in place of Wm. Hafey, and that Wm. Hafey be appointed a receiving judge in said precinct No. 10 in place of Geo. W. Armstrong, for the general election to be held November 6th.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The petition of Joseph Quinn, L. O. Marshall, T. F. Flucken, and 90 other citizens of the West Side, asking the Council to appropriate \$500.00 for the development and improvement of the tract of land recently acquired by the City park purposed on the West side, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the Council adjourn. The motion carried, and the Council them adjourned.
