

Grand Junction, Colorado
November 27, 1917

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 20 were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the Salvation Army Headquarters at All Colorado Avenue be given free city water, the same as other religious organizations.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The official bond of Henry Tupper, City Attorney, was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Salaries," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, November 28, at 4 o'clock p. m.
