Grand Junction, Colorado January 2, 1918

A communication from the Milne Transfer and Storage Co., asking for the city hauling, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the city hauling and transfer work for the current year be awarded to the Milne Transfer and Storage Co.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Daily News be designated as the official newspaper of the City from this date until July 1st, 1918.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the Auditor.

L. Goodman having applied for a license as master plumber, and his bond as such having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the license be granted to Mr. Goodman. The motion carried.
