The bond of J. Goodman as pawnbroker having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bond be accepted and placed on file.

The motion carried.

The annual reports of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies and the Commissioner of Highways were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the reports were referred to the Auditor.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

First and Teller, 250 c. p.
Second and Hill, 250 c. p.

West White and West ave., 250 c. p.
Grand and Thirteenth, 250 c. p.
Hill and Eigth., 250 c. p.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea. All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
