

Grand Junction, Colorado
March 12, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 5th were read and approved.

A committee of the Cemetery Association appeared before the Council and asked for aid from the city for the maintenance of the Orchard Mesa Cemeteries.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council appropriate \$100.00 out of the General Fund for the maintenance of the Orchard Mesa Cemeteries, provided the County of Mesa give a like amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorback, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A communication from F. J. Rankin, electrical engineer of the State Public Utilities Commission, was read, the same being a report of a preliminary survey and study of the electrolysis conditions existing in the city at this time.

The following bills having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Lot 11 of Capital Hill subdivision is taxed for water frontage assessment along the entire west end thereof, while only 110 feet have pipe adjacent thereto; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said lot 11 be assessed for only 110 feet, and that the assessment in excess thereof be rebated.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned until Thursday, March 14, at 4 o'clock p.m.
